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Prodigious Work Required Elements

The applicant must submit a prodigious work in the form of a portfolio displaying a number of literary styles and genres.

- All portfolio pieces must have been written by the applicant and created or updated within three years from the time of submission.
- All pieces should be typed, in English, on 8 ½ x 11 white paper in an 11 or 12 point standard font and three copies should be submitted. Line spacing should be either 1.5 or double-spaced. *Please do not staple, bind or fold any portion – use paper clips if necessary.*
- Each page should be labeled in the upper right hand corner with the applicant's last name and first initial, category, the genre being represented and the title of that piece, and page numbers in the form of page x of y should also be placed in the upper right corner.
- Please page number each piece of the portfolio separately in the form of page x of y.
- Submit three copies of the portfolio.

Component One:

A **60- to 75-page portfolio** of prodigious work containing three of the following four genres:

- Fiction
- Nonfiction
- Poetry
- Drama or Screenplay

Please note:

- Each genre may be represented either by one piece or by several pieces, as long as three distinct genres are included. (For example, in the fiction genre, applicants may submit several short stories or one longer novel excerpt as well as pieces from two of the other genres.)
- Applicants may choose how many pages to allot to each genre, as long as the total portfolio is not less than 60 pages or more than 75 pages.
- Please page number each piece of the portfolio separately in the form of page x of y.

Component Two:

Applicants must submit a 500-word **reflective essay** about the works in the portfolio. Please title this piece "Reflective Essay" and follow the page header and numbering instructions above.

All application materials must be sent in ONE package, including the completed application with all components and attachments. Do not send any of these items separately.

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Attachments to the Application

Please include the following attachments when submitting your application.

Attachments One, Two and Three should be typed, in English, on 8 ½ x 11 white paper in an 11 or 12 point standard font and three copies should be submitted. *Do not staple, bind or fold any portion.* Each page should be labeled in the upper right hand corner with the applicant's last name and first initial, category, title of submission and the words Attachment One: Significance Essay; Attachment Two: Benefit to Society Essay; Attachment Three: Process Essay - Part One and Part Two, respectively. Page numbers in the form of page x of y should also be placed in the upper right corner. Please page number each Attachment separately. All Attachments are to be completed by the applicant. The word count or length of the Attachments is up to the applicant. **Failure to follow these guidelines may result in disqualification.**

ATTACHMENT ONE: *Significance Essay*

Please submit a detailed description of your work and explain why your submission qualifies as a significant piece of work, as defined by at least one of the following criteria:

- exceptional creativity
- a new idea with high impact and/or broad implications
- an innovative solution with regional, state and/or national implications
- an important advancement that can be replicated and built upon
- an interdisciplinary discovery with the potential to effect positive change
- a prodigious performance

ATTACHMENT TWO: *Benefit to Society Essay*

Please explain how your work may make a positive contribution to society or has social relevance.

ATTACHMENT THREE: *Process Essay*

Part One: Please answer the following questions:

- What inspired you to pursue this work?
- How much time (hours/days/months) did it take you to complete this work?
- How did you organize the work that went into doing it?
- What difficulties did you encounter and how did you handle them?

Part Two: Please answer the following questions:

- Where was the work completed?
- Who supervised your work? (Give names, titles, addresses, e-mail, and phone numbers)
- What help have you received in doing this work?
List who helped you and what assistance he/she provided.
(Please include individuals who offered equipment, ideas, critiques, materials, methodology, etc.)

ATTACHMENT FOUR: *Video Describing Prodigious Work*

Submit three copies of a maximum 15-minute, home-production quality video recording, on a DVD that will play on any standard DVD player. Please test all DVDs before submitting. DVDs must be labeled with permanent marker only, do not affix adhesive labels to the disk itself.

You are encouraged to speak "from the heart" in your video, rather than reading directly from a script. The videotape is a chance to talk about a topic not addressed in the essays or to expand upon a point the essays touched on only briefly. Suggestions for the structure of the video:

- In the first few minutes of the video, you should briefly describe your submission summarizing why it was done, its significance, its benefit to society/social relevance and other details of your prodigious accomplishment.
- Continue by describing how you became interested in this project, how it evolved and how working on it has helped you develop your talents.
- Next, describe how your submission fits into the larger context of the field of study and be sure to describe the specific ideas/people/theories that influenced your work.
- Conclude your video with a brief description on how you think your work/talent should be applied/highlighted.

Please label all three DVDs with your last name and first initial, category and title of prodigious work, and "2010 Davidson Fellows Application, Attachment Four."

Note: Applicants in ALL categories must submit Attachments 1 through 4 IN ADDITION to all elements described in the Prodigious Work Required Elements portion of this application.

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Davidson Fellows Nominating Forms
